The Department for Education have created a new category: "Coasting schools". Schools that have been deemed as 'Good' by OFSTED in their previous inspection are now judged against a new list of DfE criteria which examines the test results from the end of Key Stage 2 from 2014, 2015 and 2016. They have looked to see:

- If any subject has a result where less than 85% of the children have reached Level 4+ OR,
- If any subject has a result where less than 85% of the children have reached the new at Expected level in any subject in 3 consecutive years

As a result of these new criteria we are considered to be a Coasting school. We are welcoming a dialogue with the Regional Schools Commissioner Rebecca Clark who will be liaising with to ensure that your children achieve their potential.

On Tuesday the 17<sup>th</sup> January, Pensans High Fives Team went to Mounts Bay Dome to play against Mousehole School. It was a great game with enthusiastic team spirit.
