<u>Project Overview</u> <u>Action Aid, Build Africa and Ace</u>

We are really excited about our next REAL project (Rigorous, Engaging, Authentic Learning). We are going to be working alongside charities Build Africa, World Vision, Oxfam (buy a goat) and Ace. The outcome for this project is to send children to school in Africa. To launch our project, the children will be building their own classroom to experience the hardships that children, in other countries, have to endure to get an education. You will be invited in to support your children in creating this. The children will then have to create a product to raise money to fund the education of another child.

In Maths the focus will be on multiplication and division and mastering times tables. We hold challenge based sessions where the children will need to use maths to solve real problems linked to their projects.

In Literacy we will be focusing on a variety of texts such as, One Hen, Beatrice's Goat and Rain School, which illustrate the lengths that children go to in order to go to school.

Project Timeline

<u>Launch -</u> Build classroom with families and teachers.

Outcome 1- Produce an information text about climate, poverty, education and gender divide exploring the impact that these areas have on children's lives.

Outcome 2 - Create a persuasive piece of writing to appropriate audiences e.g. MPs and businesses with a view to fundraising to support charities.

Outcome 3 - To create an event to raise money to provide education for children in parts of Africa

Project Outcomes

Throughout the REAL Project, we aim to produce high quality outcomes linked to our final event. This term, a lot of our outcomes will draw on our speaking ,listening and maths skills as we will be holding a charity event and raising funds to support educating children in other countries. In order to answer the essential question, we will also be learning about the issues that affect children living in poverty and investigate what education means to them.
