Project Overview

We are really excited to welcome the children back this term and are so excited about being back together as a school. Our new project starts this week with a focus on oracy and storytelling.

Our project is based around the story of 'Tuesday' by David Wiesner. We have planned three mini outcomes which will lead into our main outcome of an art and oracy trail around our school grounds. We are hoping that we can share this with parents in light of the possible lifting of Covid restrictions, but we will confirm this nearer the end of term.

Also as part of the project we are hoping to revamp our pond area, so if you have any suggestions we would love to hear your ideas.

The children will get the opportunity to visit Morrab Gardens, Tangle Woods and research our school environment as part of their outdoor learning.

Reading

Curriculum Links

- * Literacy - Learn and innovate the sequel story of 'Tuesday' by David Wiesner. They will have the opportunity to research and present a news report on 'Tuesday's' incident. We will also revise different spellings, punctuation and grammar.
- * Maths - Learn and develop our understanding of mixed numbers, fractions and finding equivalent fractions and decimals.
- * Art - Create Waterlily art inspired by Claude Monet and create their own 3D waterlilies.
- * DT- Design and make a bug hotel.
- * PHSE - Learn how to use the internet responsibly and safely.
- * History - Create a biography of a historical figure.
- * Science - Understand how different forces work and investigate the effects of friction and air resistance.
- * PE - Athletics and 30 active minutes.
- * Music - Finding the pulse in music and improvising using instruments.

For their homework, children will need to complete at least 10 minutes of Sumdog Maths and 10 minutes of reading. For their reading homework, they can complete a daily log of what book they have read. We have an example of this on SeeSaw.
