## Are you entitled to Free School Meals?

#### Is your child in Y3 to Y6?

To receive Free School Meals in Y3 to Y6, parents must be in receipt of one of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit

If you think your child may be entitled to Free School Meals, complete a form (available from the office) and we'll send it to the local authority for you. If your child can begin to have Free School Meals we will receive the funding to cover the cost.

#### Is your child is in Reception, Y1 or Y2?

Children of this age are automatically eligible for free meals as part of a government initiative that started last year. HOWEVER if parents of children in this age group receive one of the above benefits then please do ask for a form from the office if you have not already done so since your child has started school. This will ensure that we receive valuable funding from the government. We put this funding called "Pupil Premium" towards many essential resources such as additional teaching groups for children who require extra help; breakfast club and whole school training to enable us to give your children the best learning opportunities. 
Unfortunately we do not get this funding unless parents complete and hand in the form.

If your child is having Free School Meals already and you have filled out the form at any point during their time in school because you were eligible, then you **do not** need to fill out another one.

Summer Reading Challenge - Congratulations to all those that took part in the summer reading challenge at local libraries. If children completed the whole 6 book challenge and they bring their challenge book list into Mrs Crummay they will get a prize from school.

Read every night at home! - All children are expected to read their reading book every night at home and just in time for the new term we have lots of lovely new books in the library and lots more on the way, so there will be no shortage of books to choose from!

Late library/reading book reminder - some children still have overdue books from last term please could they be returned or paid for ASAP.





In school bags today is a **Pupil Arrival and Collection Leaflet** that must be signed by **all** parents and carers please. The leaflet has a form (page 3) regarding drop off and collection arrangements which needs to be returned to class teachers ASAP.

On the reverse (page 4) is the new term's **Car Pick Up Scheme** form. Please could this be returned by every parent wanting to use the pick up point after school, even if you are currently using it. This will ensure we have everyone's current details. Spare copies are available online if you have a printer or from the office.

On the topic of forms, there are still some outstanding **Student Personal Information** forms. As a result there are many students with out of date permissions and parent contact details. Please ask at the office if you need another copy. We need these returned for our files as a matter of urgency.
