Dear Parents and Carers,

We are delighted to share with you the latest OFSTED report following our inspection on 13th March 2018. The school remains GOOD! Below are some of the many highlights; you can find the full report on our website.

The leadership team has maintained the good quality of education in the school since the last inspection.

We are constantly reviewing the effectiveness of our Teaching and Learning so that your children achieve.



You lead a dedicated team whose members have high expectations for each pupil. The team is unrelenting in its pursuit of higher standards.

The Inspector was extremely impressed by the enthusiasm, expertise and commitment of all staff at Pensans School.

Each member of the team brings enthusiasm to their role. Under your watch and approval, you encourage them to explore innovative methods to improve the quality of teaching, learning and assessment across the school. Leaders have designed teaching and learning methods based on close monitoring of the strengths and weaknesses in the school. Each member of your leadership team has overseen improvements in their area of responsibility and more widely across all aspects of the school. They each speak candidly and knowledgeably about every area of school improvement, supporting each other in their roles and working seamlessly as a team. As a result, your school improvement priorities interweave throughout the school, and you have created a culture in which it is 'everyone's business' to improve pupils' outcomes.

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Over the past two years we have worked hard to increase the children's engagement and enthusiasm for learning. Using REAL projects and purposeful immersive classrooms have enabled us to achieve this.

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Pupils in your school benefit from a unique curriculum. They value the opportunities they have, as they are based on real-life experiences.



We want your children to be confident ambassadors for the school and positive members of the community. The Inspector recognised that our curriculum and approach to learning and Virtues Education is enabling us to achieve this.

Pupils do not see this as 'just learning', but making a difference. They are great advocates for the school's curriculum approach and speak knowledgeably about the difference they are making in the local, national and wider community.

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At Pensans School your child's well being and safety is our primary concern.

You have placed the well-being, welfare and safety of pupils at **11** the heart of all that you do.

You and your wider team are passionate about pupils whom you serve, and you act swiftly and with tenacity when any issues relating to safeguarding arise. In short, your vigilant actions keep all pupils safe.

As you may know, over the past two years, standards in Maths at the end of Key Stage 2 have been below those achieved Nationally and we have introduced Maths Mastery to address this. The Inspector found that:

Pupils' mathematics books across key stage 2 demonstrate strong progress

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They have a balanced mathematical diet

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Pupils' books are extremely well presented. Pupils are proud of their learning and they work with care when showing their calculations and workings out

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In lessons, teachers are highly skilled in drawing out pupils' knowledge and understanding. They adeptly challenge all pupils, carefully choosing the most effective line of questioning, depending on the needs of each pupil. Staff have high expectations of pupils

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Your mathematics leader maintains a strong overview of the quality of teaching, learning and assessment and its impact on pupils' progress.

The Inspector also looked at Phonics and Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar across the school.

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Pupils confidently participate in phonics lessons and actively join in with the rhymes which accompany specific sounds they are learning.

Leaders have successfully raised the profile of spelling, punctuation and grammar across the school. A bespoke, innovative approach is already improving outcomes in this area. Classroom environments support pupils' learning, and this has resulted in pupils feeling more confident to accurately apply their understanding and knowledge. As a result, pupils successfully apply the skills that they have learned across a range of writing.

Behaviour was recognised as a strength at our school:

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Pupils conduct themselves well across the school. Across the school, pupils are courteous and welcoming to visitors, holding doors open for each other and adults.

Pensans is a vibrant exciting place to learn. We have made changes to the way that we teach and your children learn. We are still at the beginning of our journey; this Inspection Report validates our approach and our commitment to your child's achievement in the 21st century. Please talk to your child about how proud we are of them and our school.
