Phase 3 Overview - Spring 1 2017-18

What are the key issues in this area?

- Reading results (KS2) currently significantly below national expectations (63%) achieved over 100 (expected). This was increase of 8%.
- Writing results (KS2) currently below national expectations (61%) achieved over 100 (expected). This was decrease of 9%.
- SPAG results (KS2) currently significantly below national expectations (63%) achieved over 100 (expected). This was increase of 11%.
- Maths results (KS2) currently significantly below national expectations (54%) achieved over 100 (expected). This was increase of 13%.
- Spelling aspect of SPAG paper was significant in depleting the overall results. Reasoning paper 1 significant in depleting overall Maths results with large number of children within 95-99 bracket of Maths scaled score
- Changes in staffing to upper KS2 over past years but consistent across 2016-17 and 2017-18.
- Maintaining challenge for higher achieving children while increasing amount of children achieving expected level.
- High amount of children in current Year 6 achieving expected or greater depth level at KS1.
- Currently 23/38 (61%) children in Phase 3 are Pupil Premium with 3/38 SEND (8%). This compares with 3 SEND children in last year's cohort and 59% PP.
- Some difficulties in timetabling regular Pupil conferencing although use of targets has been consistently implemented.
- Increase in the amount of children achieving over the expected standard in Maths, Reading and Writing over the course of the first half-term.
- Writing levels currently below other subjects across phase
- Reasoning aspect of Maths papers currently less successful than arithmetic
- High representation of PP children in Developing and Emerging brackets within Year 5.
- Lower amount of children achieving progress in reading this half-term in both year groups, potentially due to shortest half-term to show significant progress

How can we triangulate/prove this in the classes across the school?

- Moderations held across classes and MAT to level children's writing examples
- Book scrutinies implemented in phases on weekly basis to ensure coverage and standards maintained.
- Standardisation of marking policy to implement expected standards
- Subject observations for Reading/SPAG/English
- Regular intervention and data analysis (half-termly) across phase and in collaboration with SLT to analyse effectiveness of intervention/other children to consider.

How do we know?

- Ongoing data collection on Scholar Pack.
- Half-termly data analysis.
- End of KS2 data scrutiny.
- End of KS1 data scrutiny.
- Checks to ensure PP children making expected/ accelerated progress and children achieving L3/2A at KS1 maintaining progress.
- Book scrutinies
- Pupil conferencing by phase leader

What have we done to address these?

- Book scrutinies across phase to ensure coverage and quality of books is consistent.
- Group and individual reading/writing/maths interventions focused on children's targets/gaps in learning some great accelerated progress made.
- Writing groups in KS2 creating books linked to topic work.
- Maths planning addressed through Hub/TPAT training to focus on deeper understanding/mastery
- Marking policy redesigned to incorporate spelling corrections (by children) in each written piece - targeted at key age-appropriate words and topic-based vocabulary.
- REAL projects embedding the critique process throughout the school and developing children's use of feedback and self/peer assessment.
- Spectacular SPAG and Splendid Spelling embedded into planning on daily/ weekly basis to drive key skills.
- Teacher-led booster sessions run weekly in Reading/SPAG/Maths to ensure coverage/small group focus for EVERY child.
- SATs homework club run weekly to help children with focus areas implement again in Spring term.
- Planning done in phase to ensure consistency and clarity.
- Children confidently talk about their learning and are engaged in all lessons and through pupil conferencing
- Children aware of their targets and next steps
- Reading Cloud introduced to allow social media aspect of reading/book reviews/recommendations.
- Series of initiatives (e.g. Virtues Ambassadors, Reading Buddies) implemented to ensure children have active role in making the school a better place.
- Interventions now targeted to Year 6s (especially those achieving greater depth at KS1 in Maths). Good impact on progress of previous Maths intervention children.
- 99 Club introduced for Maths fluency
- 10/15 in 10 practised across the phase on daily basis to drive up reasoning paper scores.
- Booster sessions starting immediately after half-term for Year 6 across Reading, Maths, SPAG. Impact was good last year but aim is to drive this from earlier in the year.
- Parent guides for Maths/Spelling.

What has the impact been? What does the data show?
