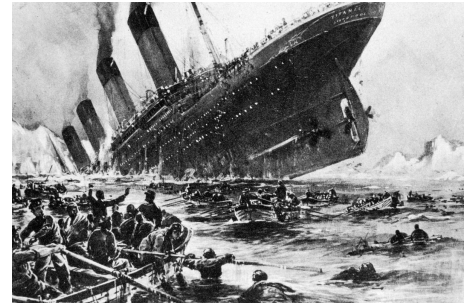

Project Overview

How Does a Ship Wreck?

Our next REAL project (Rigorous, Engaging, Authentic Learning) will focus on shipwrecks with a particular focus on the Titanic and local wrecks. We will be answering the question, 'How does a ship wreck?' The project will highlight how people lived in the past and how wrecks have shaped the future. Our launch will take place at the wonderful Maritime Museum in Falmouth where we will meet the Captain of the Titanic. The trip will be very informative and will be a wonderful experience for all of the children. If you have any resources or stories of local shipwrecks that you would like to share with the children please let us know. Alongside our project work will run our weekly 99 Club tests and of course, Athletics and TT Rockstars. Attached is a homework guide for you to have a look at. Curriculum Links

- * Literacy - Fact books about local shipwrecks and the Titanic.
- * Maths - Numbers and the number system, counting and comparing, properties of shape, addition and subtraction and exploring time.
- * Art - Beach art, portrait of Captain Smith and drawings of the Titanic.
- * PHSE - Weekly virtues.
- * RE- Christianity.
- * Humanities- Locational knowledge - where did the Titanic sink - naming oceans and continents. Knowing the 4 countries of the UK.
- * PE - 5 A Day Daily Sessions, Active Maths Sessions, dance and swimming.
- * Science - Forces and light and sound.

Essential Information

- We expect children to read every evening at home. Reading books and records need to be brought to school each day in their bag.
