Pick up point

Although we would always encourage walking to and from school, to help ease congestion at the end of the school day we run a pick-up-point facility. We encourage



as many parents to use this as possible. Parents need to sign up to the service each academic year by completing a form. Parents will be allotted a pick up time according to their child's year group and given a time-slot card to display in the car. Extra cards can be requested for grandparents etc.

We ask parents to arrive at school at the time on their cards and not before. To keep traffic flowing in the car park and the main roads, pick-up point parents will have to drive around and come back if their child/children are not there - pick-up point cannot be used as a car park. If you have more than one child, the pick-up time will depend on the age of the oldest child. Thank you for your cooperation.

Parents / carers are asked to ensure that all children are strapped into their appropriate car seats please. A worrying number of children are not strapped in on the way to school and when leaving.
