WHAT'S NEW?

This is a really positive set of views which many schools can only dream of. 100% of respondents agreed that children are happy, safe, are taught well and would recommend our school to other parents.

98% believed that their children make good progress, are well looked after and that the school manages behaviour well, and is well led. No one considered that the school did not deal effectively with bullying, that fact that 3 people (6%) "don't know" is likely to reflect the positive fact that this has happily never been an issue for them or their children.

That 85% of parents consider Communication to be at least Good and no one sees it as Poor is a big step forward. All parents thought that the topic based approach was positive for their children, and 96% thought that the work with the Eden Project was at least Good. 98% thought that the Car Pick up service had made a difference

to reducing congestion on site.

Based upon these responses, plus staff views on the effectiveness of our current arrangements for Home Learning we intend to conduct a review of our practices from September 2012. Over half of those who responded would like access to homework online and this will be available from early in the Autumn Term. We are also planning more parental support sessions.

No parents believed that they would not be listened to by the school if they had a concern and that it would act appropriately. We plan to provide parents with more regular and detailed progress information based on the fact that 20% were unsure about this. We also plan to reform a PTA from the Autumn Term based on these responses.
