# **UNIFORM REMINDER**

We would like to thank all of those parents who consistently ensure that the school's expectations on Uniform and PE Kit are upheld. Generally speaking the standard of presentation is very high, and supports our belief that school uniform is beneficial because :

- It is a great leveller and removes the pressure on children to wear designer clothes and trainers, and on parents to pay for them!
- Parents don't have to have a daily battle about what's appropriate to wear for school as children get older.

- ✓ Blue School Sweatshirts only Yellow Hoodies may be worn for PE but not during the school day as an alternative to a school sweatshirt
- ✓ Children need **PE** Kit in school every day please.
- ✓ PE Kit is a **House** T-Shirt, & Black shorts
- ✓ No jewellery except watches are allowed in school for safety and practical reasons
- $\checkmark$  Please make sure all uniform is clearly named

Well done to the High 5 team who have reached the Semi-Finals of the Penwith Cup this week and despite playing very well lost narrowly to St Hilary.


## **CAN YOU HELP US PLEASE?**
