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Supporting children through key adults



Computer and video games have a Pan-European Game Information (PEGI) rating printed on the front of the case. If your child is at Pensans, any game they play or watch should have a green PEGI. Please be aware that playing games out of their age range is a child protection issue and be aware of what they are playing. Even if your child is only watching an older family member playing a game with a 12, 16 or 18 rating, they still are being exposed to unsuitable material.

Summer Reading Challenge - This years theme is Space and as usual all the children have to do is visit any library and read 6 books throughout the summer collecting stickers and incentives along the way. https://summerreadingchallenge.org.uk/

The National Literacy Trust suggest that, parents can help back up the learning acquired over the year and support language and literacy skills through the summer. It's really important to keep reading with children over the holidays; research has shown that children who read outside the classroom every day are five times more likely to read above the expected level for their age compared to children who never read outside class. Reading will prevent "summer slide" – where a child might forget what they've learned at school in the many weeks off over the holidays.






Recipe for beetroot burgers:

Method:



Clean and peel beetroot, onion and potato. Grate these ingredients into a bowl. Put all the grated veg into a tea towel and squeeze it hard to get the water out. Mix all the ingredients in a bowl and shape into burger shapes. Fry on a low heat until brown on both sides. Serve in a bun with burger stuff. Yum
