#### Key stage 1 tests - year 2 pupils

Your dilitit's teacher is responsible for judging the standards your shift is working at in English reacting. English writing, mathematics and science, by the and of key stage 1. To help inform those judgements, pople sit retional cantoutum teaca in English and mathematics, commonly called SATs. They may also sit an optional test in English gramma, punctuation and spalling.

The tests are a tool for teachers to kep them measure your child's performance and identify their needs as they more into key stage 2. They also allow teachers to see how your child is performing against national expected standards.

The tests can be taken any time during May and they are not strictly timed. Pupes may not even know they are taking them as many teachers will incorporate them into everyday classroom activities.
