# <u>Project Overview</u> 'No land is an island,' Discuss....


We are really excited about our next REAL project (Rigorous, Engaging, Authentic Learning). We are going to be researching and comparing geographical features of Hawaii and the UK as island nations. Through fundraising activities and a "Luau Festival" we are hoping to raise money for The Surfing Wave Project in Cornwall and Surfrider Spirit sessions in Hawaii to support well being in children.

To launch our project, the children will be researching and creating a mixed media mood map answering the essential question in a Hawaiian themed day at school.

In Maths the focus will be fractions, multiples, factors, decimals, percentages, coordinates, graphs, measures, statistics and algebra. As part of our maths learning, we will be holding challenge based sessions where the children will need to use maths to solve real problems linked to their projects.

In Literacy we will be focusing on writing for fundraising, debates, poetry and biographies of surfers linked with our class novel and information texts about the UK and Hawaii.











#### Curriculum Links

- <u>Literacy</u> Persuasive letter writing for fund raising from organisations, information texts about Hawaii and UK, debating and a biography about a surfer.
- <u>Maths</u> -revisit the 4 operations, fractions, multiples, factors, decimals, percentages, geometry and statistics.
- <u>Science</u> Evolution and living processes and their habitats and life cycles.
- Computing Programming design and write programmes Using Numbers App to create a variety of data about island life. Researching Hawaii and UK.
- Art -Pop Art Styles using colour blocks in the style of Heather Brown and Laurie McCall.
- PE -Gymnastics and Hawaiian dancing
- Music -Learning to play the ukulele and Hawaiian music for our festival.
- Geography-Map work plotting and understanding of equator/tropics/continents including a knowledge of the countries that the equator and tropics go through. Physical Meaning of Biomes, vegetation belts. Human types of settlement and land use, economic activity including trade links, and the distribution of natural resources including energy, food, minerals

resources including energy, food, minerals and water. Comparing and contrasting Hawaii and UK as island nations.



## Project Timeline

Launch - Create a mixed media mood map answering the essential question in a Hawaiian themed day. Outcome 1 - Write a biography about a researched surfer. Outcome 2 - To argue for and against the case for choices made by others in communities and the effect they have on others Outcome 3 - Organise a Luau Festival and learn to play the ukulele for this festival. Final Outcome - Luau festival selling artwork and merchandise to raise funds for our chosen charities. Where: Jubilee Pool
