

The Equator:

An equator divides the planet into a Northern Hemisphere and a Southern Hemisphere.Earth is warmer near the equator because the equator receives energy from the sun at a more direct angle than the rest of the planet.Both the Arctic (North Pole) and the Antarctic (South Pole) are cold because they don't get any direct sunlight.
