Dear Parents/Carers

This week we have had great festive cheer with all the children participating with Christmas joy and enthusiasm in their Christmas productions. Their singing was fantastic and bought a tear to many eyes. The links for these will be emailed to you when they are ready. All of the children participated in the Christingle service held at St Mary's Church via zoom and created their own Christingles to share with you at home. Our Year 6 children brainstormed people who bring light into our world and wrote and performed a class poem as part of that zoom service. They demonstrated great creativity and excellence in their performance. A quick reminder that the Christmas Fayre has been cancelled on Wednesday 15th December but we are going ahead with Christmas jumper day and Christmas dinner on that day.

Please can you continue to follow our staggered times for collecting your children regarding road safety as well as helping with fewer people being on site at one time. It also eases congestion in the carpark. Please also use the car parking spaces provided if you are getting out to drop off your child and not block pick up point. This is helping to make it safer and more efficient at these times of the day.

Please can you remember to read daily with your child and discuss their book with them so they have a clear understanding of the text and develop their vocabulary and imagination further to support their writing.

We are continuing to liaise daily with TPAT and Public Health England whilst monitoring the local COVID infection rates and government protocols to make sure that we are operating as safely as possible. **Please be vigilant and follow the Government guidance if your child develops COVID symptoms, inform the school immediately and take them for a PCR test.** Please can you wear a mask on site unless you are exempt and follow social distancing as there has been a large spike in local schools and we are trying to keep safe and well in the build up to Christmas.

A quick reminder if your child had sickness or diarrhoea they must stay at home for 48 hours after.

Please remember to book your child's Christmas dinner by 8am Monday 13th December to make sure that enough food is ordered and prepared.

Violet Class - through shared area doors to the left of Reception area.




