Project Overview How Does a Ship Wreck? Welcome back- This term's REAL project (Rigorous, Engaging, Authentic Learning) will focus on shipwrecks with a particular focus on how lives can be saved at sea. We will be answering the question, 'How safe is the sea?' The project will highlight how people lived in the past and how wrecks have shaped the future of sea rescue. Later in the term we will visit The Maritime Museum in Falmouth where we will be able to hear stories from the museum staff about famous wrecks and rescues. The trip will be very informative and will be a wonderful experience for all of the children. If you have any resources or stories of local shipwrecks that you would like to share with the children please let us know. Alongside our project work will run our weekly 99 Club tests and of course, Sumdog and TT Rockstars. As we get closer to Christmas we will be reading the Mousehole Cat and using this as a basis for our own sea inspired tales. We will also look at the importance of the Penlee Lifeboat disaster and how it shaped the future of saving lives at sea. We will communicate with you very soon about PE
