We will always prioritise children's well being and engagement and enthusiasm for learning.

The school will be running in the same way that we did in the Autumn Term. Children will remain in their Bubbles throughout the day with the same staggered start and finish times. Lunchtimes and playtimes will be staggered as they were last year, children will wash their hands on arrival, regularly throughout the day and have their temperatures taken in the morning.

Drop off - 8.50am

Pick Up - Green, Orange, Amber - 2.50pm

Green and Orange Class - through the KS1 playground near the disabled parking bay.

Amber Class - Doors to the right of Reception area door.

#### Phase 2 -Cobalt, Violet and Indigo

Drop off - 8.40am

Pick Up - 2.40pm

Cobalt Class - through end doors in KS1 playground, near the disabled parking bay.

Violet Class - through shared area doors to the left of Reception area.

Indigo Class - through the gates to the main playground and then through the shared area doors.

Wednesdays 12.40pm pick up.

#### Phase 3 - Turquoise

Drop off - 8.30am

Pick Up - 2.35pm

Through the gate to the main playground and straight onto the playground

Wednesdays 12.30pm pick up.

#### Families with more than one child.

Drop Off - 8.45am. Pick Up - 2.45pm

Wednesdays 12.50pm pick up.

You will need to ensure that you arrive on site at your designated times wearing a mask so that we can reduce the number of adults on site at any one time. Please remember that physical distancing rules remain in place and you should keep a 2-metre distance from other adults and socialise only with your support Bubbles. Where possible only one adult should bring children to school.

Wednesday afternoons will be used as home learning for the majority of children and this will give us the opportunity to deep clean mid week. If your circumstances have changed since December and you are unsure whether your child is eligible for a place on Wednesday afternoons please email messages@pensans.cornwall.sch.uk and let us know.

Thank you for raising the issue of uniform. Many children may have grown out of uniform and we would like you to bring in clean, old uniform, dropping it off in plastic containers that will be outside the School Reception on **Monday 1st March**. The uniform will then be quarantined and sorted into sizes so that you can come and pick up any items that you need on **Tuesday 9th March**. So that we can keep to the Government guidelines we would like you to bring uniform at the following times:

EYFS - 9.30am - 10.15am

Phase 1-10.30am - 11.15am

Phase 2 - 11.30am - 12.15pm

Phase 3 - 12.30pm - 1.15pm

Our PTA will sort the uniform into sizes so that you can easily find clothing that you need. Our expectation is that children wear uniform, however we will continue to have doors and windows open during the school day and children will be allowed to wear coats and as many additional layers of clothing that they need to keep warm.


#### Eliza's ending ...
