Dear Parents and Carers.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your support since January. Whether your children have remained in school or you have been doing all you can to support them at home; I appreciate the flexibility and resilience that you have shown throughout this challenging time. Next week our focus will be on ensuring that children settle back into school with confidence and we will do everything that we can to help all children enjoy their learning and friendships. All of the measures that will be in place on Monday 8th March are there to minimise the risk of spreading Covid19 thereby protecting staff, children and families so that we can continue to move forward towards better times ahead.

To support us in minimising risks it is essential that we all keep to the following protocols:

- Arrive at school at your childs/children's designated time. Please see next page for a reminder of the times.
- One adult brings their child/children.
- Adults wear a face mask, if exempt please wear a lanyard indicating your exemption.
- All adults keep a physical distance from other adults including staff.
- Adults leave the site quickly and do not congregate to chat.
- Families do not mix with anyone other than their existing support Bubble when at home.
- Children line up outside their class drop off point as soon as they arrive at school not with children from other families/bubbles.
- If your child is unwell do not bring them to school follow NHS guidance and report their absence to the school.
- If you or a family member develop symptoms of Covid19 do not bring your child/children to school and follow NHS quidance
- If you need to contact a member of staff please email messages@pensans.cornwall.sch.uk
- If you need to speak with myself please message or phone to make an appointment.
- If you have an appointment in school please come to Reception, sanitise your hands and take your temperature before the meeting.

When children arrive in school they will wash their hands and frequently throughout the day as they did throughout the Autumn Term.

There is now home-testing available for families. You can access this independently should you choose to do so. Details about obtaining test kits can be found in the Coronavirus section of our website. We will NOT be testing children in school. Staff now test themselves at home twice a week.

Thank you for bringing in any uniform that your child/children have outgrown. This is being prepared for collection on Tuesday 9th March at your designated time slots. You will need to follow the protocols above when on site.

I can't thank you enough for your kindness and generosity. We are so excited to have the children back in school, each of them brings joy and is a valued member of Pensans.










Born Free have launched their very first Youth Filmmaker and Photographer of the Year Competition. https://www.bornfree.org.uk/kidscompetition

This spring, students can engage with nature in a fun and creative way. The competition is open to all children aged 16 and under, no previous experience or specialist equipment is required – just a passion for telling exciting, local wildlife stories.

Students can either work in groups or individually. It's a perfect long-term project for those hoping to spend a little more time offline this spring. Wildlife can be found all around you. No cameras are required either – students can capture images using whatever equipment they have to hand, including tablets or smartphones.

Participants are invited to submit either a series of up to six photos that tell a story, or a short film (up to three minutes long), that has the natural world as a central focus, with a clear and powerful narrative.

This year's theme is Hope Springs Eternal. Nature has been a source of hope for so many over the past year. Help your students share the hope that the natural world brings to them by signing up today. The closing date for the completion is 31st May 2021.
